Board Summaries for April 19, 2022

R&O 2022-057 - This is an Intergovernmental Agreement between Linn County and State of Oregon, acting by and through its Department of Corrections (DOC) to provide .49 FTE Probation Officer Liaison, Transitional Housing, Transportation Assistance, DMV ID Assistance, and Shelter Services. This agreement is in effect from July 1, 2021 to June 31, 2023 for a not to exceed amount of \$385,907.35. This agreement is for pass thru funds from the Criminal Justice Commission, Justice Reinvestment Grant Program.

R&O 2022-107 - This is an Amendment #5 to the letter of agreement between Linn County and Samaritan Lebanon Hospital to detain and transport allegedly mentally ill person to another hospital or facility approved to provide involuntary emergency care for those allegedly mentally ill persons. This amend extends the agreement to April 18, 2023.

R&O 2022-115 - This is a Student Affiliation Agreement between Linn County and Samford University College of Health Sciences to provide unpaid internships to students in the Masters Level Mental Health Programs.

R&O 2022-016 - This is an Intergovernmental Agreement between Linn County and The National Association of County and City Health Officials (NACCHO). The NACCHO has awarded Linn County a grant in the amount of \$10,000 to support the Medical Reserve Corp (MRC).

R&O 2022-117 - This is a Personal Services Agreement between Casa Latinos Unidos and Linn County to provide Health Navigation Support to Latinx Community in Linn County. This agreement is in effect from March 1, 2022 to June 30, 2023 with an amount not to exceed \$110,000.00. Casa Latinos Unidos will hire a minimum of 1 FTE bilingual/bicultural staff member to conduct outreach and service coordination to the Latinx community in Linn County. This agreement is pass thru funds from the State of Oregon.

R&O 2022-121 - This is a Memorandum of Understanding between Linn and Lincoln County to coordinate the expansion of outreach service in Lincoln County by providing access to breastfeeding peer counseling program services for woman, infant, and children (WIC) participants.

R&O 2022-134 - This is for Appointing Members and Confirming Vacancies to the Linn County Mental Health Advisory Board. Position 2, 4, 6, 8, 9, and 13, shall remain vacant. The following members are being appointed:

We have concluded negotiations for the renewal of the Linn County Deputy Sheriff's Association (DSA) Collective Bargaining Agreement (CBA). The Association ratified the agreement on March 25, 2022. Highlights are listed below for your review. The successor CBA will be presented to the BOC for approval on April 14, 2022 as R&O 2022-136.

The new Collective Bargaining Agreement includes:

- Three-year agreement with a 5% COLA and 3% market adjustment in year one, year two and three include a 2-3% COLA based on CPI.
- Adds third longevity step at 20 years (2.5%) which is consistent with all other bargaining units.
- Added HRA/VEBA at the beginning of the second year. County pays 1% of base salary to fund the program and adds an additional 1% at the beginning of year three.
- Incorporates HB2930 language (discipline and discharge).
- Changes clothing reimbursement from \$300 every two years to \$150 per year allowance.
- Allows vacation accrual adjustment for certified lateral transfers.
- Miscellaneous language changes to provide clarification or improve processes.

The management bargaining team included The Linn County Sheriff and Undersheriff, all division Captains, the County Administrative Officer and Diana Moffat (labor attorney). The management team recommends approval of the successor CBA.

SUBJECT: Juvenile Detention Workers Association Successor CBA Highlights

We have concluded negotiations for the renewal of the Linn County Juvenile Detention Workers Association (JDWA) Collective Bargaining Agreement (CBA). The Association ratified the agreement in late March. Highlights are listed below for your review. The successor CBA will be presented to the BOC for approval on April 14, 2022 as R&O 2022-137.

The new Collective Bargaining Agreement includes:

- Three-year agreement with a 5% COLA in year one, year two and three include a 2-4% COLA based on CPI.
- Adds third longevity step at 20 years (2.5%) which is consistent with all other bargaining units.
- Removes Detention Worker 1 from the bargaining unit.
- Allows limited cash out of comp time twice per year (increased from once per year).
- Allows double time for certain mandated shifts.
- Adds \$100 annual equipment reimbursement benefit.
- Miscellaneous language changes to provide clarification or improve processes.

The management bargaining team included the Juvenile Department Director and Juvenile Detention Manager, the County Administrative Officer and Diana Moffat (labor attorney). The management team recommends approval of this successor CBA.
