- Subject: ITS ConGlobal Enterprise Zone Application and Action Approving an Extended Tax Abatement Agreement

ITSC is the operator of the Mid-Willamette Valley Intermodal Center and is leasing (via an Operating Agreement) the facility and the equipment from AMEDC.

They have completed an Enterprise Zone Authorization Application dated April 28, 2022.

Under regular enterprise zone exemption rules the company is required to add 10% to their existing workforce in the zone, which is 1, they plan on hiring 9 additional employees. The regular property tax exemption is for 3 years.

For companies that agree to hire and pay wages and benefits in excess of 150% of Linn County's Average Annual Wage, the firm can qualify for an additional 2 years. The current required wage number can be found in the agreement.

Attached is the draft resolution which needs to be passed by each co-sponsor. The zone manager (me) and the county assessor's representative (Mark Wilkinson) cannot officially approve the company's application until the resolutions are approved by the co-sponsors.

Detention

Probation

The Juvenile Department received 45 referrals during the month of April 2022.

Of the 45 referrals, 18 represent dependency, 12 status and 14 criminal.

There are currently 171 youth in the Probation Unit either on probation or pending court with 44 of those being assessed high-risk.

There are currently 56 youth under the Community Programs Unit serving on informal probation and the Intervention Specialist is currently serving 87 youth. 80 of those youth are from the community with no involvement with law enforcement.

Work Crew

Tier 1 - 6 youth completed 104.50 hours of community service in 8 project days. In 2021 6 youth completed 82.25 hours of service during the same time period.

Subject: Resolution & Order #2022-168 seeks the Board of Commissioners' Approval to award the re-roofing of the Armory Building

Russ Williams, Director of General Services, will appear before the Board with Resolution & Order 2020-168, requesting the Board's approval to enter into a contract with ABC Roofing, a Tecta American Company, LLC to re-roof the Armory building.

The bid and contract have been legally reviewed by the County Attorney's Office for completeness, as well as the County's roofing consultants, A-Tech/Northwest, Inc., see attached.

The contract amount is \$406,220.00. The funding for this work is calculated in the County's 2022-2023 proposed budget.

The work is to begin after July 1st, 2022 and will be completed before October 21, 2022. Thank you for supporting our efforts to maintain the County's assets.

Russ:

Attached is the Linn County - Armory Building summary spreadsheet of the bids for the 2022 Singleply and Composition Shingle Reroof project on this facility. Five (5) roofing contractors attended the pre-bid meeting and two (2) contractors' submitted quotes. The attached spreadsheet indicates the contractor's bids as well as breaks out the key categories that are on the Pricing Submittal Form documents.

This project (*ITB 2022-038*) had a base bid (#-1) plus an alternate bid (#-2). The alternate was supplied to provide a cost to replace the gutters on the single-ply/main roof with a standard 5" K-style gutter, rather than matching the existing/ornate gutter. The apparent low bidder (*Roof Toppers, Inc.*) has been disqualified as they are missing the cost for metal work in the base bid (#-1) and did not provide a quote for the alternate (#-2).

Based on this review of the bids, our recommendation is to award the work to the low bidder ABC Roofing based on their Base Bid #-1 at \$ 406,220.00. If you prefer to change the gutters to the standard k-style, the Alternate Bid #-2 came in at 394,564.00.

We highly recommend awarding the project now rather than attempting to re-bid the project. The roofing market at this time is very busy, and the numbers that we are seeing are significantly higher each quarter due to the lack of material availability. Based on the current market conditions, and the risk of material delays and higher costs, we do not believe that rebidding this project again this year or holding until 2023 will benefit the County.

If you agree with our recommendation, please advise us ASAP as to which option, if other than the base bid, you want to proceed with. Upon award of contract, we will expedite the submittal approval process and schedule the pre-construction (*pre-job*) meeting, etc.
