Update for July 2022

Detention

Benton: 3 youth were held for 68 total of days of care, 1 females and 2 males.

Total Admissions to Detention = 3

Average Length of Stay = 22.67days

Average Daily Population = 2.19 youth

Linn: 20 youth were held for 198 total of days of care, 4 females and 16 males.

Total Admissions to Detention = 20

Average Length of Stay = 9.90 days

Average Daily Population = 6.39 youth

Lincoln 3 youth were held for 28 total days of care, 0 females and 3 males

Total Admissions to Detention = 3

Average Length of Stay = 9.33 days

Average Daily Population = 0.90 youth

Probation

The Juvenile Department received 30 referrals during the month of July 2022.

Of the 30 referrals, 11 represent dependency, 12 status and 7 criminal.

There are currently 163 youth in the Probation Unit either on probation or pending court with 41 of those being assessed high-risk.

There are currently 55 youth under the Community Programs Unit serving on informal probation and the Intervention Specialist is currently serving 25 youth. 20 of those youth are from the community with no involvement with law enforcement.

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Victim Advocate is serving 63.

Cases Unassigned: 17

OYA Cases: 48

Work Crew

Tier 1 – 5 youth completed 64.50 hours of community service in 8 project days. In 2021 1 youth completed 8.75 hours of service during the same time period.

Tier 2 – 18 youth completed 494.25 hours of work crew in 22 project days. In 2021 18 youth completed 383.00 hours of service during the same time period.

Summer groups operated during the month of July, served about 25 youth. -*

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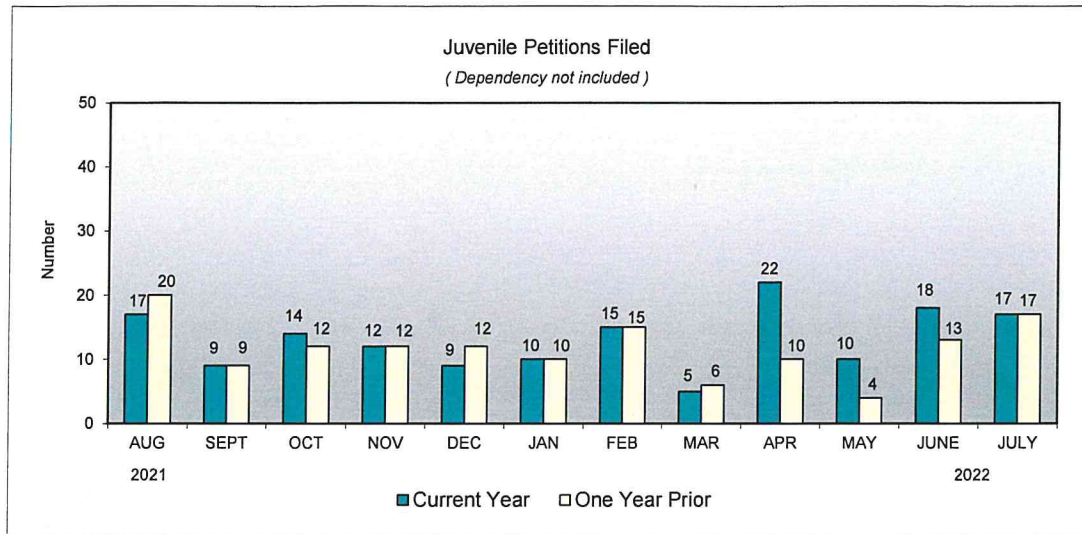

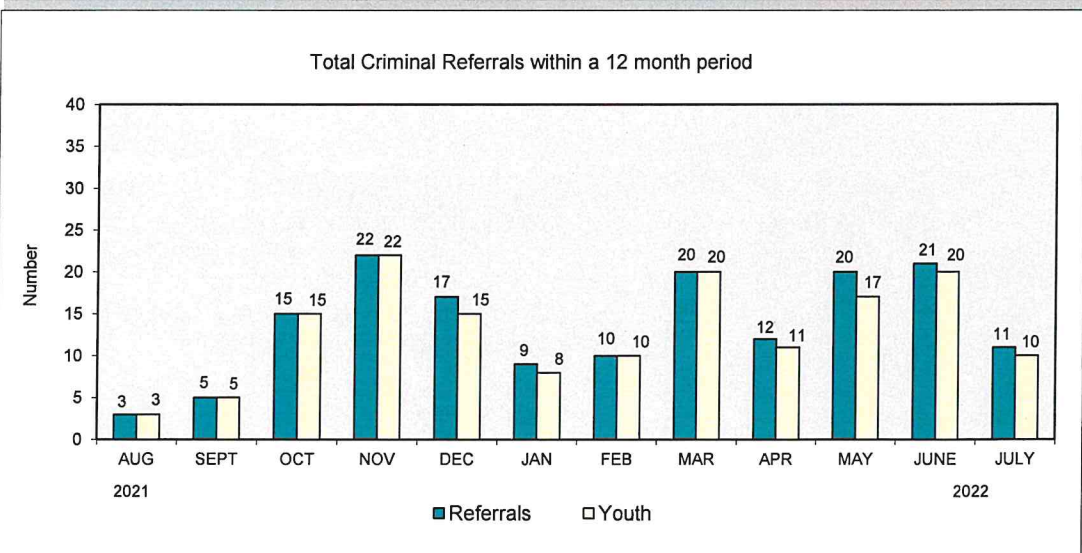

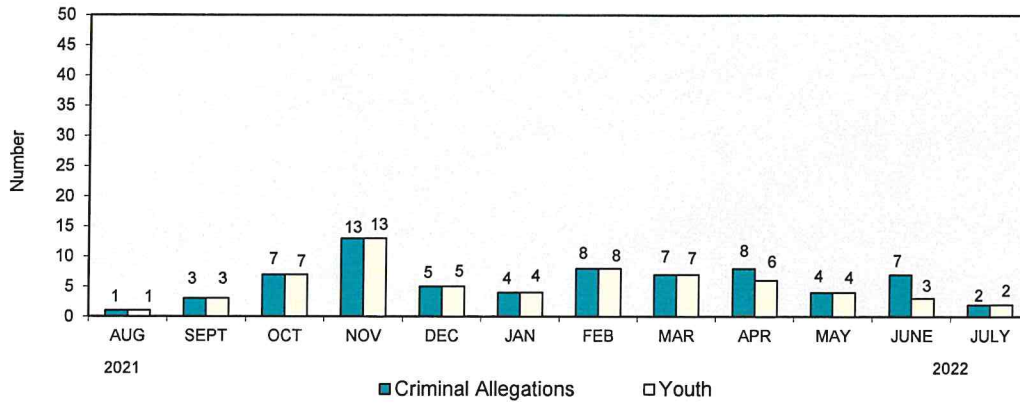

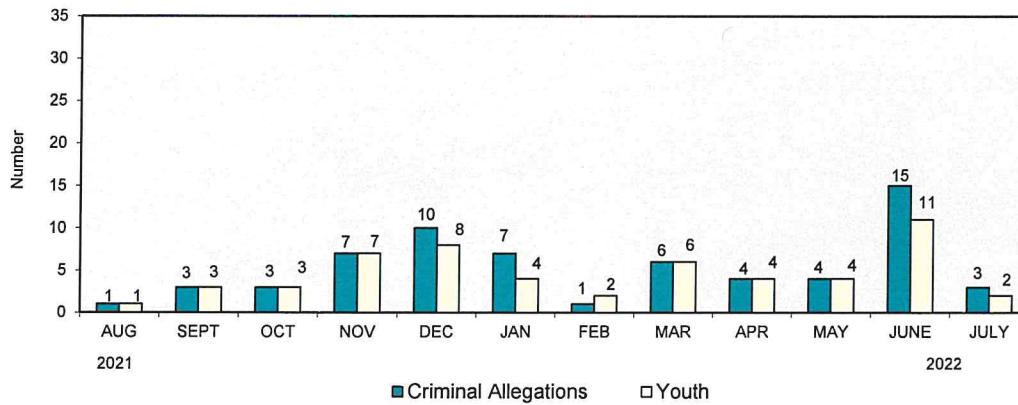

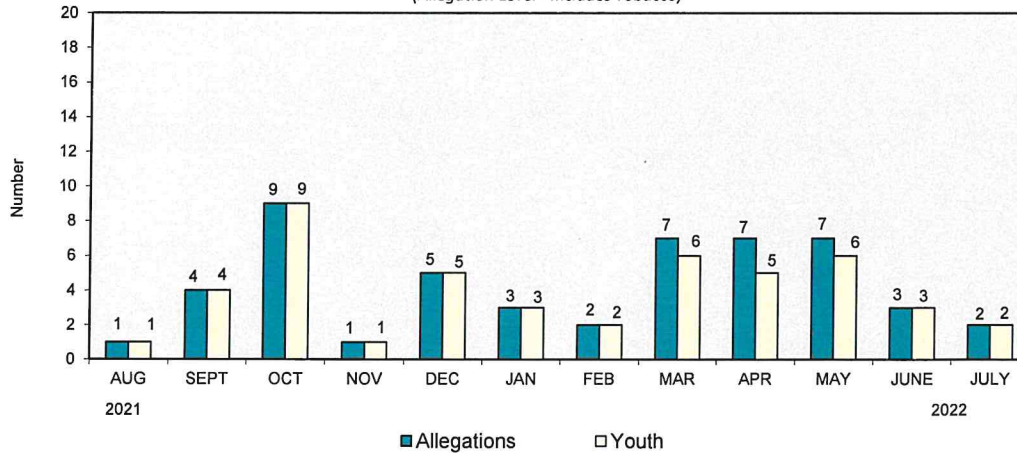

It is respectfully requested that the Board of Commissioners for Linn County approve this request to enter into an amendment No. 2 to a grant award with the Public Transit Division of the Oregon Department of Transportation; and that the original conforming to Exhibit 1 be executed this day with Reagan Maudlin, Special/Rural Transportation Coordinator, be delegated authority to sign the original bearing this resolution and order number.

This amendment changes the classification of bus from what was previously approved by ODOT for capital spending; it does not change the award amount. The amendment is prompted by immediate need and limited supplier options. I have spoken with each of the Commissioners regarding the amendment change and circumstances of the requested nunc pro tunc.
