This is an IGA between the Linn County Sheriff's Office and the Oregon State Fire Marshal's Office (OSFM). OSFM is agreeing to pay \$10,000 for a project emphasizing wildfire community preparedness as it relates to wildfire evacuation education, communication, or planning. This money will be used to help pay employee costs for time spent developing pre-planned Everbridge notifications related to wildfire evacuations as well as time spent developing and holding an evacuation exercise scheduled for June 2023.

### **Update for January 2023**

### **Detention**

Benton: 3 youth were held for 9 total of days of care, 0 females and 3 males.

Total Admissions to Detention = 3

Average Daily Population = 0.29 youth

Average Length of Stay = 3.0 days

Linn: 26 youth were held for 268 total of days of care, 10 females and 16 males.

Total Admissions to Detention = 29

Average Daily Population = 8.65 youth

Average Length of Stay = 9.24 days

Lincoln 6 youth were held for 75 total days of care, 1 females and 5 males

Total Admissions to Detention = 7

Average Daily Population = 2.42 youth

Average Length of Stay = 10.71 days

### **Probation**

The Juvenile Department received 46 referrals during the month of January 2023.

Of the 46 referrals, 4 represent dependency, 20 status and 18 criminal.

There are currently 179 youth in the Probation Unit either on probation or pending court with 37 of those being assessed high-risk.

There are currently 70 youth under the Community Programs Unit serving on informal probation and the Intervention Specialist is currently serving 85 youth. 82 of those youth are from the community with no involvement with law enforcement.

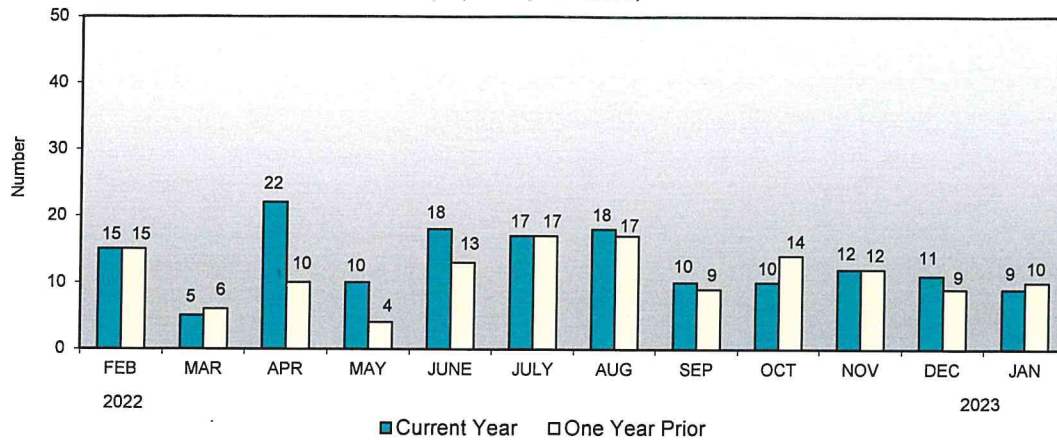

(Dependency not included)

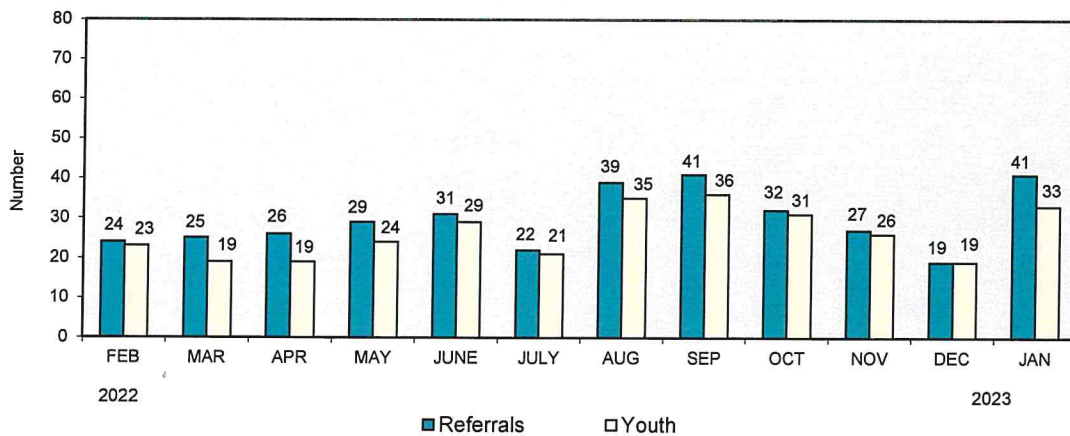

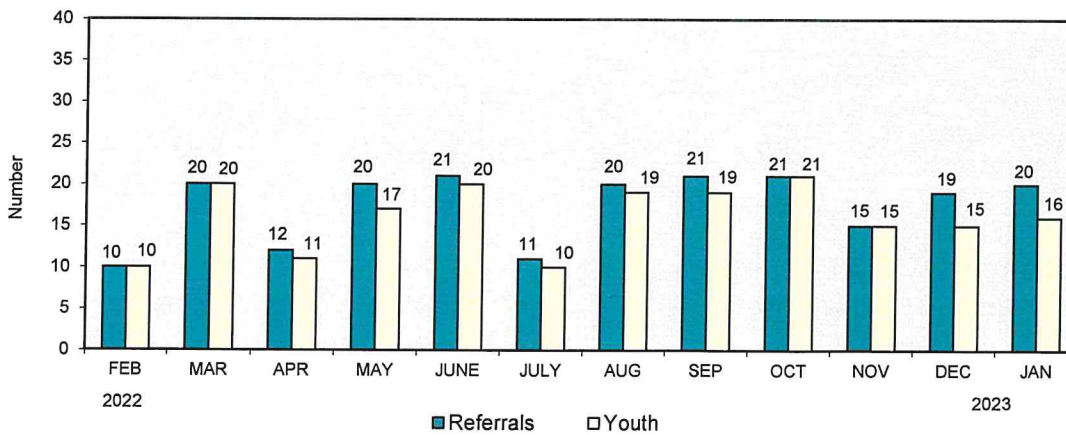

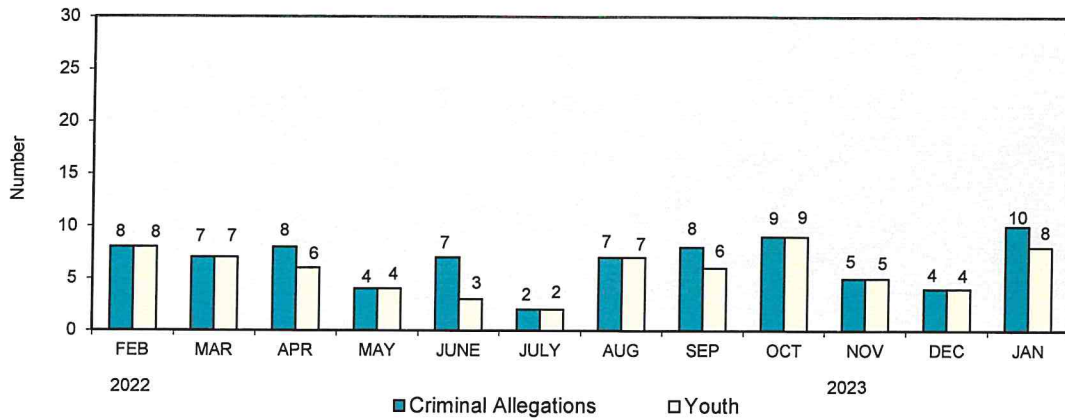

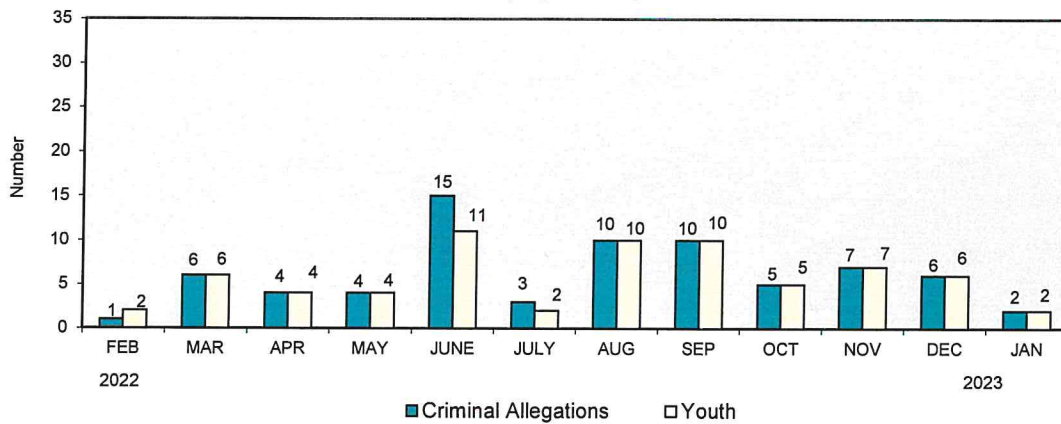

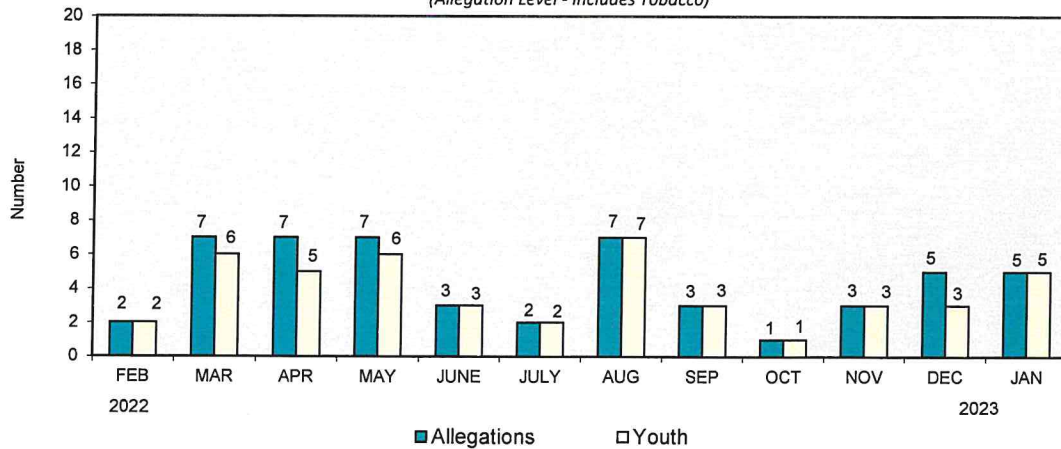

Property Management received two requests from the City of Albany for the transfer of tax-foreclosed property. I recommend approval of these transfers.

1. Resolution & Order 2023-059 approves the transfer of a 1 foot strip at the corner of 31<sup>st</sup> Avenue and Geary Street. The city is planning a sidewalk project along Geary Street. If transferred, the city plans to convert the parcel into street and utility right-of-way. Property details:
