Re: Linn County Emergency Operations Plan Promulgation

<u>Resolution & Order 2025-:</u> The Linn County Emergency Operations Plan (EOP) has been updated; the previous version dated back to 2022. This revision was a collaborative effort involving multiple county departments and partner agencies. A significant portion of the update focused on incorporating lessons learned from the 2023 and 2024 wildfire seasons, as well as the 2024 winter storm.

Additionally, this version removes the Emergency Support Functions (ESFs) and replaces them with seven Community Lifeline Annexes. The Community Lifelines model, developed by FEMA, provides a more streamlined approach for designating roles and responsibilities within local government operations.

<u>Financial Impact:</u> Having a current EOP on file helps Linn County maintain compliance with FEMA for future grant opportunities.

Probation

The Juvenile Department received 41 referrals during the month of May 2025.

Of the 41 referrals, 16 represent dependency, 10 status and 15 criminal.

There are currently 156 youth in the Probation Unit either on probation or pending court with 21 of those being assessed high-risk.

There are currently 88 youth under the Community Programs Unit serving on informal probation and the Intervention Specialist is currently serving 175 youth. 165 of those youth are from the community with no involvement with law enforcement.

Victim Advocate made 120 contacts.

Tier 1-6 youth completed 73.25 hours of community service in 6 project days. In 2024 11 youth completed 152.25 hours of service during the same time period.


Tier 2 - 18 youth completed 364.50 hours of work crew in 16 project days. In 2024 19 youth completed 280.50 hours of service during the same time period.

Restitution Program – 1 youth completed 52.50 hours



Resolution and Order 2025-236

An Intergovernmental Agreement between Linn County and Lincoln County for Juvenile Detention Services.

RO 2025-236 renews the contract agreement for Lincoln County Juvenile Department to place youth at the Linn Benton Juvenile Detention Center as a per youth, per day payment. The rate at which Lincoln County will be paying per youth is \$175 per day. Lincoln Co. remains responsible for all medical, mental health treatment outside the normal services offered within the detention center. Lincoln Co. will also be responsible for transporting their youth to any court hearings or other appoints they need to make.

Board Summaries for June 24, 2025

Resolution & Order No. 2025-205

This Personal Contract is between Jackson Street Shelter and Linn County for one shelter bed. Linn County will rent one shelter bed at a daily rate of \$148.53 to be used for Linn County Mental Health Mobile Response and Stabilization Service (MRSS) youth clients. This rate will include meals, laundry, items for basic needs will be available for young people during their stay.

Resolution & Order No. 2025-228

Amendment No. 2 to the Intergovernmental Agreement between the Oregon Health Authority (OHA) and Linn County. This amendment requests the return of \$30,000 in unspent funds from the Intoxicated Driver Program Fund, as Linn County was unable to fully expend the awarded amount.

Resolution & Order No. 2025-230

This is an Intergovernmental Agreement for the Financing of Public Health between Oregon Health Authority (OHA) and Linn County. This agreement is effective July 1, 2025 to June 30, 2027.

Resolution & Order No. 2025-234

This Order is for the matter of certain health services accounts deemed uncollectible. The accounts are 180 days old as of April 30, 2025, and are uncollectible.
